

CHAPTER CHAT REPORT

Committee members Janet Fingleton, Trish Knevitt and Hazel King attended the February 15th meeting of the Chapter hosted by Kangaroo Valley Pioneer Museum.

Low attendance to meetings over the last couple of years led to this meeting's discussion regarding the future of the chapter. The executive positions have been held by the same people for many years and no one present was willing to take over their roles.

The meeting decided that the chapter 'be declared dormant'; a period of two years is allowed in the constitution of the Royal Historical Society. It is hoped that during this period the chapter can be revitalized. Failing this, loss of membership of the Society will result.

Following the business meeting, Dr Mary Hutchinson from the Australian University and National Archives gave a talk about community history and its importance. Various examples of the work of museums and other community groups proved of great interest. Discussed were projects, displays, exhibitions, talks, all involving members of a community.

WORLD WAR 1 DISPLAY STAGE 2

We are receiving excellent comments on this latest phase of our WW1 display. It focuses on those men who were local men or who enlisted locally and then went on to serve at Gallipoli. Our display also deals with other aspects of the Gallipoli campaign, including the nurses who cared for the wounded on Lemnos and in Egypt.

Of especial interest to visitors is the "Dead Man's Penny" (so named by the troops) of which we have two. The 'Penny' is a large bronze medallion which was presented to the next-of-kin of the servicemen and women who died during WW1. Ours were the generous gift of the Conway family. Brothers William and Daniel were killed in France, 1916 and 1918.

EARLE CROSS – PICTURE



In 2013 Earle Cross painted the Berry Anzac Day Service. It was his wish that it be hung publicly in memory of his much loved father and as a tribute to the serving men and women of the district. Earle died in November 2014, the painting was gifted to the Berry & District Historical Society.

Members of the Society who have listened to the disc which is part of "a Drivers Guide to the Historic Town of Berry" will remember that Earle was the narrator.

Earle was a resident of Broughton Vale. The Cross family's first convict ancestors, James and Mary Ann Hall settled in what was then called Broughton Creek in the eighteen forties. They lived in a slab hut on the site of the present day NAB bank. A number of their descendants still live in the district.
